REQUEST FOR DISPOSAL OF WASTE CONTAINING PESTICIDES FROM UPL WAREHOUSE IN CORNUBIA.

The previous authorisations issued to DCLM for the treatment and disposal of pesticide-containing waste from the UPL facility refers. All of those authorisations have since lapsed.

A request was made by DCLM on 16 November 2022 for exemption from provision 5(1)(g) of the Norms and Standards for Disposal of Waste to landfill (2013) which relates to the disposal of waste containing pesticides to landfill. The reason for this is that more contaminated water from the UPL site has been removed and being taken to DCLM for treatment. Post treatment, the concentrate would need to be disposed of and it may contain varying concentrations of pesticides.

The Department hereby grants DCLM permission to accept this waste for treatment and disposal for a period of 6 months from the date of issue of this letter. Such treatment and disposal must be carried out in accordance with the treatment methodologies provided to the Department on 23 July 2021.

DCLM is to report to the department, at the end of each month, the quantity of waste accepted at its waste disposal facility for treatment and the quantity of concentrate that is being disposed of. Your attention is drawn to the liquid waste disposal restriction in terms of the above Norms and Standards, which must be complied with.
